100 Plus Club Rules With Effect 1 June 2016

The 100 Plus Club rules have been revised to reflect the increased participation and will provide greater chances of winning.

If you are not already a member and would like to join the monthly draw please read the rules below. Thank you for your interest in the 100 Plus Club Monthly Draw

The rules of the draw are:

Under Section 16.2 of the Gambling Act 2005 no one under the age of 16 is allowed to compete in this lottery.

- Each member is allocated their own unique numbers.
- Members may have more than one number if they choose and each number cost £1.
- At one of our monthly meetings a draw will take place by computer using a random number selection program.
- Two numbers will be drawn each month.
- The owners of the selected numbers will receive 50% of that month's income and the Branch will retain the remainder of that income. The winning money will be split of this as follows:
 - o 1st number drawn will receive £50.
 - o 2nd number drawn will receive the balance left of the prize money.
- When the 2nd drawn number balance reaches £50, the Branch Committee will again review the allocation of the 50% prize money.
- In order to make payment easy to collect we ask that you make your payment by Standing Order from your bank account. We would be obliged if you would fill in the Standing Order form which you can download and return it to Diane Humphreys at the address on the form by post.
- 100 Plus Club Draw members will be advised of any changes to these rules.

The form cannot be completed on line and submitted electronically or by telephone or text only postal applications can be accepted.

If you decide to have more than one number, only one form is required to be completed. Just increase the amount to be paid accordingly on the form.

Please remember to sign the form for our records.

If at any time you wish to withdraw from the 100 Plus Club please inform Diane Humphreys at the address on the form.

Please do not attempt to promote the 100 Plus Club on any social media, such as Facebook. This is not allowed under the Gambling Act 2005 and National Lottery Act 1994.
