300 Plus Club Monthly Draw

With Effect 1 January 2020

Thank you for your interest in the *300 Plus Club Monthly Draw*.

The rules of the draw are:

- Under Section 16.2 of the Gambling Act 2005 no one under the age of 16 is allowed to compete in this lottery.
- Each member is allocated their own unique number.
- Members may have more than one number if they choose and each number cost £1.
- Once a month, a draw will take place by computer using a random number selection program.
- Two numbers will be drawn each month.
- The owners of the selected numbers will receive 50% of that month's income and the Branch will retain the remainder of that income. The winning money will be split as follows:
 - The 1st number drawn will receive 35% of the month's income
 - The 2nd number drawn will receive 15% of the month's income
- A Bonus Prize Draw will be added with all monthly entries going back into the draw to win a monthly prize which will be sponsored by Attorney Wills.
- Some examples of prizes available will include Cinema Tickets, Meal Vouchers etc.
- In order to make payment easy to collect we ask that you make your payment by Standing Order from your bank account. We would be obliged if you would fill in the Standing Order form which you can download, complete, and return to Bill Hogg at the address on the form by post or by hand.
- The form cannot be completed on line and submitted electronically or by telephone or text. Under Section 9.1 of the Gambling Act 2005 only postal applications or those completed by hand can be accepted.
- If you decide to have more than one number, only one form is required to be completed. Just increase the amount to be paid accordingly on the form.
- Please remember to sign the form for our records.
- If at any time you wish to withdraw from the *300 Plus Club* please inform Bill Hogg at the address on the form.
