
Movement to Music


Incurable Optimist



Parkinson's medication management while in hospital

Researchers at Manchester Metropolitan University are investigating whether changes in medication management while in hospital has an impact on recovery when people return home.

Who do the researchers need?

- 350 people with Parkinson's
- who are taking Parkinson's medication
- and have recently attended a hospital visit or have a visit planned in the near future

What is involved?

- You will be asked to complete one survey per month for 6 months following a hospital visit.
- The surveys can be completed online or by post and will take 30-40 minutes to complete.

If people with Parkinson's don't get their Parkinson's medication on time it can seriously impact their health. The medication schedule is often unique for every individual, based on their symptoms. When people with Parkinson's attend hospital, they may not be given the opportunity to manage their own medication. The researchers aim to determine whether missed or delayed medication while people are staying in hospital can lead to health problems and unnecessarily extended hospital stays.

I look forward to seeing you and of course anyone else who would like to come along on the 20th. I promise I will bring words and not sheet music!










Group secretary needed
