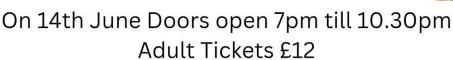

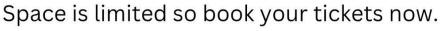

World Parkinson's Day

World Parkinson's Day is celebrated globally on April 11th an annual event that has been taken place since 1997. In 2005 the tulip was adopted as the official symbol of Parkinson's at the 9th World Parkinson's Disease Day Conference in Luxembourg. However, the flower had been informally associated with the disease for more than 20 years prior to that. Back in 1980, a Dutch horticulturalist named J.W.S Van der Wereld – who was living with Parkinson's – developed a new red and white variant of the tulip.



He named his newly cultivated flower the *Dr James Parkinson* tulip in honour of the medico who first documented the features of Parkinson's disease in his 1817 publication *An Essay on the Shaking Palsy* recognising Parkinson's as a medical condition for the first time.

We mark his birthday every 11th April with World Parkinson's Day, shining a spotlight on Parkinson's, raising awareness in the wider community. Together, we can create a greater understanding of the challenges people with Parkinson's and their loved one's face. And it's a brilliant opportunity to raise funds for research and support services.

Why Light Up Blue:

Blue is associated with Parkinson's disease primarily through the "Light Up Blue" campaign, which is a global initiative to raise awareness and support for the condition. This campaign encourages people to light up their homes, buildings, and local landmarks in blue on World Parkinson's Day, April 11th, according to Parkinson's UK. Blue is often seen as a colour representing hope and optimism, and the campaign aims to show solidarity with the Parkinson's community and highlight the need for ongoing research and support.

The 'Spark the Night'or 'Light up Blue' campaign is a global event to raise awareness by lighting up monuments and buildings in blue. Swindon Borough Council lit up the Central Library.

When 2 NHS trusts merged Ted was made redundant, but he made it his quest to make the necessary changes before he left to provide a vital service. His actions and determination resulted in the provision of a Parkinson's nurse service dedicated to this area providing access for 100's more people with Parkinsons'. A truly selfless man who wanted no reward but was delighted to give his name for this award to be presented to those who have made a real difference and provide outstanding services dedicated to help those living with Parkinsons.

Martin Upfold takes to the skies on behalf of Parkinson's UK Saturday 14th June



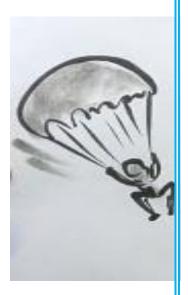
